ORDER NO. 153-79ORDER

This day this cause came on for hearing before the State Oil and Gas Board of Mississippi on the Petition of Kilroy Company of Texas, Inc., to define the producing reservoir on a 640 acre gas well in the Glancy Field, Copiah County, Mississippi, such hearing being called for such purpose; and

The Board finding that due, proper and legal notice of the meeting of the Board for the purpose of considering and taking action with respect to such matter was given in the manner and way provided by law and the rules and regulations of the Board and that due, legal and sufficient proofs of publication are on file with the Board and that the Board has full jurisdiction of the subject matter to hear and determine same; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said notice given, public hearing was held by said Board in the Second Floor Auditorium of the Woolfolk State Office Building, Jackson, Mississippi, commencing on June 20, 1979, at which hearing all persons present who desired to be heard on said matter were heard and all testimony and evidence were duly considered by those present at said meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Board has fully considered said matter and the evidence and recommendations made in said hearing and finds as follows:

1. Kilroy Company of Texas, Inc., has, as operator, drilled its International Paper Company No. 1 Well on a 640 acre unit composed of Section 5, Township 9 North, Range 7 East, Copiah County, Mississippi, on a permit duly issued by this Board. The well has been completed as a gas well productive from the Rodessa Gas Pool.

The producing intervals within said Rodessa Gas Pool are 14,906 feet to 14,930 feet of a true vertical depth from the surface. The well was actually drilled to a total depth of 16,415 feet.

2. The said Rodessa Gas Pool is a reservoir because it is a producible natural accumulation of natural gas confined by the impermeable rock barriers and characterized by a single natural pressure system and it is a reservoir or pool entirely disconnected from any and all other gas pools and reservoirs.

3. The said gas unit conforms with statewide rules and regulations, with the location being 1,500 feet from the East line and 1,500 feet from the South line of said Section 5, Township 9 North, Range 7 East, Copiah County, Mississippi.

4. The said gas unit is underlain by more than the minimum number of productive acres required to entitle said unit and well to allocation of full, daily production allowables.

5. That the establishment of said unit and designation of Kilroy Company of Texas, Inc., International Paper Company No. 1 Well with full daily production allowables will prevent waste and will protect the co-equal and correlative rights of all parties in interest.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED, that a gas unit described as Section 5, Township 9 North, Range 7 East, Copiah County, Mississippi, containing 640 acres, more or less be hereby designated for the Kilroy Company of Texas, Inc., International Paper Company No. 1 well with the producing gas reservoir from the Rodessa formation with producing intervals from 14,906 feet to 14,930 feet of a true vertical depth from the surface, and said producing sands be hereby defined by this Board, and said well be hereby granted full allowables.
